

Scholarship for members of female institutes of consecrated life, societies of apostolic life, secular institutes and ecclesial communities as well as other applicants: Doctorate in Spiritual Theology or Theological Anthropology

The *Carmel Forum Foundation* announces one scholarship especially intended for members of female institutes of consecrated life, apostolic societies, secular institutes and ecclesial communities for Doctorate in Spiritual Theology or in Theological Anthropology at the "Teresianum" Pontifical Theological Faculty - Pontifical Institute of Spirituality.

The scholarship covers only academic fees. Funds are paid directly to the faculty for the following fees: three annual enrolments, delivery and the defense of doctoral dissertation and degree diploma, for a total of 4.200 € (Status: academic year 2022-2023; any fee increases will be taken into account).

The grants are renewable after the first and second year on condition of renewal of enrolment. Grants for the delivery and defense of the doctoral dissertation as well for the degree diploma are granted under the condition that they take place no later than the fifth academic year after the first enrolment.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

The scholarship is especially intended for members of female institutes of consecrated life, societies of apostolic life, secular institutes or ecclesial communities who possess a university degree at Licentiate level (or equivalent) in Theology and all the requirements necessary for enrolment in the third cycle at the "Teresianum" Pontifical Theological Faculty - Pontifical Institute of Spirituality.

Applicants are kindly requested to send the following documents (in either Italian, English, French, Spanish, or German) by e-mail, to info@carmelforum.com:

a) Motivation Letter (about 300 words) explaining the reasons for undertaking studies at the Teresianum, whether personal or related to one's Institute or the local Church;

b) Curriculum Vitae, including detailed information about the candidate's religious, scholastic and academic training, language skills, as well as any other information the candidate deems useful;

c) photocopy of an identity document;

d) for members of institutes of consecrated life: a letter of presentation from the Major Superior stating the intention to assign the student after the completion of her studies at the Teresianum to theological research, teaching or some other service for which the Doctorate would be useful.

Applications for scholarships must be submitted by 10 June 2023. A decision will be communicated by 1 July 2023.
