Contributions are encouraged on the following topics, but not limited to:

- Spirituality and Liturgy: required to analyse the distinctive features of spirituality and liturgy in the Eastern Churches, highlighting the cultural and historical influences that have shaped them.
- **Mystagogy and Spiritual Formation**: investigate the mystagogical methods and spiritual formation utilized in Eastern communities, highlighting their inherent educational practices that characterise these contexts.
- Eastern Monasticism and Contemporary Religious Life: conduct inquiries into the meaning and value of monasticism in Eastern Churches, focusing on its historical roots, impact on spirituality, and relevance in the context of contemporary consecrated life.
- Theological Anthropology: bringing out anthropological reflection concerning the theology of the Eastern Churches, exploring sources, developments, and current debates. sources, developments, and current debates.

THE MAIN THEME OF THIS CALL REVOLVES AROUND THE EASTERN CHURCHES. WE ENCOURAGE SCHOLARS AND EXPERTS TO REFLECT ON THE THEOLOGICAL, SPIRITUAL, LITURGICAL, ANTHROPOLOGICAL, AND **ECCLESIAL DIMENSIONS OF THESE CHURCHES** 

- **Eastern Ecclesiology**: insights into the spiritual dimension of the ecclesiology of the Eastern Churches, examining their structure, governance and communion with the universal Church.
- Carmelite Spirituality and Eastern Christianity: drawing reflections on the connections between the mystical and spiritual tradition of Teresian Carmel and the mystical and spiritual traditions proper to the Eastern Churches, identifying possible mutual influences and points of convergence.
- Ecumenical Dialogue: highlight ecumenical efforts and dynamics of dialogue between the Eastern Churches and other Christian traditions.
