

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS AND PUBLICATION ETHICS

1. Originality and authorship

By submitting a contribution, the author guarantees that the manuscript is original, written by the submitting author(s), and does not contain any form of plagiarism or unauthorized use of third-party material. The author further guarantees that the manuscript has not been previously published and is not under consideration for publication elsewhere.

2. Copyright and licensing

By submitting and publishing in *Teresianum*, the author grants the journal the right of first publication. All articles are published under a Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY 4.0) License (<https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0/>).

In exceptional cases required by funding conditions or institutional requirements, a Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial (CC BY-NC 4.0) License may be applied. In such cases, the applicable license will be clearly indicated at the article level.

These licenses permit unrestricted use, distribution, and reproduction in any medium, provided that appropriate credit is given to the author(s) and the journal. Reuse is governed solely by the terms of the applicable Creative Commons license.

3. Archiving and preservation

All published content is digitally preserved through Portico, ensuring long-term accessibility and preservation of the scholarly record.

4. Self-archiving and reuse

Authors are permitted to deposit either the published version or the accepted manuscript in institutional or subject repositories, provided that full bibliographic information and a DOI link to the official publication in *Teresianum* are included.

5. Publication ethics and plagiarism screening

Teresianum is committed to upholding the highest standards of publication ethics. The journal follows the guidelines of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE).

All manuscripts are subject to pre-publication plagiarism screening using appropriate similarity-detection tools. Submissions showing significant textual overlap without proper attribution may be rejected or returned for revision in accordance with publication ethics standards.

6. Peer review process

All submitted manuscripts undergo a double-blind peer review process. Each submission is evaluated by at least one independent expert reviewer in addition to editorial assessment.

7. Submission procedure

Manuscripts must be submitted electronically to: direttore.rivista@teresianum.net

Submissions should include:

- a Word file (.docx) containing the full manuscript and the author's information (first name and surname, academic affiliation, email address);
- an anonymized PDF version prepared for double-blind peer review.

The journal distinguishes between articles (studies) and shorter contributions (notes). Articles shall contain no more than 60'000 characters (footnotes and spaces included), notes no more than 35'000 characters.

Accepted languages are Italian, English, French, Spanish, and German.

The manuscript must include:

- an abstract of the article (500–1,000 characters, including spaces) in the original language;
- the title and abstract in English (if not originally written in English);
- five to eight keywords in the original language and in English;
- a bibliography including all references cited in the footnotes, arranged alphabetically.

8. Scope of the journal

The journal primarily publishes research in Spiritual Theology (particularly Carmelite studies) and Theological Anthropology. It also welcomes contributions in Theology, Church History, Biblical Studies, and Christian Philosophy.

9. Editorial process and timeline

Peer review is typically completed within three months. If accepted, authors are expected to implement any requested revisions. Before publication, authors receive page proofs for final corrections, which should be returned within one week.

After publication, authors receive a complimentary print copy of the journal.

10. Publication fees

Submission, peer review, and publication in *Teresianum* are free of charge. The journal does not charge article processing charges (APCs).
